### Staffing:

Administration and office services are contracted. The base amounts for these services will not be reduced in FY10 or FY11.

### Agency Functions:

No agency functions are expected to be eliminated in FY10 or FY11.

### Federal Funds:

No Federal funds have been or will be received in FY10 or FY11.

### Fees:

The Board collects application, registration, renewal and Limited Liability Certificate fees. The fees will not be increased in FY10 or FY11.

**Impact\Implementation:**

Remaining reappropriation will compensate for FY10 and FY11 appropriation reductions. All essential services to the public and agency functions are expected to be maintained.

The FY10-FY11 Budget Request included one \$3,500 investigation and one \$2,500 hearing for each fiscal year. Funding for the FY10 request will not be necessary. No investigation or hearing is in progress and neither have been scheduled for the remainder of FY10. Funding for the FY11 investigation\hearing request is yet to be determined, however it appears unlikely the full funding will be required. Funding required for the FY11 investigation\hearing request is estimated to not exceed \$3,500.
