

Agency 62 - Board Of Examiners Land Surveyors

Statutory Authority:

Secs. 81-8,108 to 81-8,127, Neb.Rev.Stat. (Reissue 1981) provides the authority and defines the duties of the Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors. The agency also has filed a complete set of operating regulations with the Revisor of Regulations.

Vision Statement:

The Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors protects the people of the State of Nebraska by adopting rules and regulations, reviewing applications for registration, conducting examinations, granting licenses, investigating complaints and conducting hearings. In addition, the Board collects registration fees, renewal fees and penalty fees.

Mission Statement:

The mission of this program is to enforce and administer the laws relating to regulations of land surveys through licensing in Nebraska and to improve the quality of surveyors practicing land surveying in Nebraska.

Goals:

The Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors has as its' long-range goal the protection of the People of the State of Nebraska. This protection will be provided through regulation and education of the Professional Land Surveyors in the State. The primary areas of regulation and education are professional competency, ethical practice and maintaining proficiency as new technology emerges.

Performance Measures:

As of July 1, 1998, there were 240 land surveyor registrations in force. During FY 98-99, 22 surveyor-in-training applicants were examined of which 14 were issued certificates and 9 land surveyor applicants were examined of which 7 were issued registrations. Two additional land surveyor registrations were issued by reciprocity. As of July 1, 1999, there were 232 land surveyor registrations in force. The Board investigated 1 complaint against a land surveyor in FY 98-99. As of July 1, 1999, there were 232 land surveyor registrations in force. During FY 99-00, 16 surveyor-in-training applicants were examined of which 7 were issued certificates and 9 land surveyor applicants were examined of which 3 were issued registrations. Six additional land surveyor registrations were issued by reciprocity. As of July 1, 2000, there were 244 land surveyor registrations in force. The Board continued to investigate 2 existing complaints against land surveyors in FY 99-00.
