

Agency 51 - University Of Nebraska

Statutory Authority:

The University of Nebraska was established in 1869. The general statutory provisions for the University are Sections 85-101 through 85-220 of the Revised Statutes of Nebraska. University rules and regulations are set forth in the Bylaws and Policies of the Institution. The Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture at Curtis (NCTA) was established with its current organizational arrangement in 1988. Section 85-121, of the Revised Statutes of Nebraska places NCTA under the control and management of the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska.
